

ENBRIDGE LINE 3 REPLACEMENT	
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



- The Committee is an innovative collaborative forum
- Not a consultative body, Committee members participate **without prejudice**
- Focus on advancing **shared interests** through monitoring, capacity building, engagement, and advice.



PURPOSE

- Support **effective and meaningful Indigenous participation.**
- Enable **reciprocal exchange of information.**
- Provide a **collaborative forum** to enhance environmental protection and safety.
- Enhance and ensure **co-development.**

WHAT WE DO

Monitoring:

working with CER inspectors on joint compliance verification activities.

Capacity Building:

increasing capacity for Nations to participate

Advance Common Interests:

working together on issues that impact Nations as it relates to the Line 3 Replacement Program.

Provide Recommendations:

collaborate with Indigenous Nations to produce recommendations to the government and regulator from an Indigenous lens.


