STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS

- Committee Members and Indigenous Nations have an understanding of and **participate in Emergency Management** activities relating to Line 3; and Indigenous perspectives are reflected in Emergency Management processes and response efforts.
- **Emergency Management capacity enhanced in Indigenous Nations** with improved access to existing Emergency Management programs and with integration of Line 3 emergencies with all-hazards Emergency Management
- **Strengthened Emergency Management partnerships** amongst Indigenous Monitors, Indigenous Nations, the regulator, government and other partners involved with Emergency Management activities.

L3 IAMC engages Indigenous Monitors to participate in preparedness, response, and recovery activities.

L3 IAMC advancing its EM strategic directions:


